Historic Preservation Training Available

Hosts: City of Sanford & the Sanford Historic Trust
When: April 10-11, 2013
Location: University of Central Florida Public History Center (Formerly the Student Museum)

Cost: \$5 (covers any incidentals not allowable under grant agreement)

Purpose of the Workshop: The City of Sanford received a grant from the Division of Historical Resources, Florida Department of State, to provide regional historic preservation training to historic preservation staff, board members, and volunteers currently serving Florida Certified Local Governments (CLG) and those local governments interested in applying for the CLG program. The workshop will cover a variety of topics, taught by an experienced faculty of historic preservation officials.

The training will appeal to a broad spectrum of attendees, ranging from local government preservation staff and board members to volunteers and homeowners in historic communities.

The workshop will consist of two days of hands-on training designed to provide attendees with a baseline knowledge of proper preservation methods which prolong the life of historic buildings and conserve their integrity/character. Educational sessions will include mobile workshops and hands-on field work, focusing on historic resources in Sanford.

This project has been financed in part with historic preservation grant assistance from the National Park Service, U. S. Department of Interior, administered through the Bureau of Historic Preservation, Division of Historical Resources, Florida Department of State, assisted by the Florida Historical Commission.

Registrants may be eligible for a travel stipend of up to \$100 for travel/hotel expenses. Eligible registrants will receive confirmation of travel stipend by email. Travel stipends will be paid upon completion of full two-day work shop, once the appropriate paperwork is submitted and processed.
