Potable (fresh water) Irrigation Resumes November 3, One-Day-a-Week

During the fall and winter lawns need less water. Healthy landscapes can be maintained by watering one day per week. Landscape irrigation with potable (fresh water) will return to no more than one day a week for Sanford Utility customers when Eastern Standard Time begins on Sunday, November 3. This does not apply to those using reclaimed water.

Reclaimed Water irrigation schedule remains as follows:

- Saturday, Monday and Wednesday, homes with addresses that end in an odd number or have no addresses
- Sunday, Tuesday and Thursday, homes with addresses that end in an even number
- Water only after 4 p.m. and before 10 a.m. and only when needed.

The city's watering restrictions help ensure efficient use of water for landscape irrigation. The restrictions apply to water withdrawn from ground or surface water, from a private well or pump, or from a public or private water utility.

During Eastern Standard Time, the following schedule applies for potable (fresh water):

- Saturday, homes with addresses that end in an odd number or have no address
- Sunday, homes with addresses that end in an even number
- Tuesday, nonresidential properties
- Water only after 4 p.m. and before 10 a.m., and only when needed

Potable (fresh water) landscape irrigation will return to the two-day-a-week schedule when Daylight Saving Time returns on March 9, 2014.
