If you like it, lock it!

- Carry only the credit cards you need.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash.
- Remember where you parked.
- Always park in a well lit, well traveled area.
- Avoid parking next to vans, trucks with camper shells, or cars with tinted windows.
- Scan the interior of your car to be sure no one is hiding inside.
- Check to see if you are being followed when you leave stores.
- Have your keys in hand and be ready to unlock the vehicle door.
- Store purchased items out of sight. The best place is in a locked trunk.



- Don't resist if someone tries to take any of your belongings.
- Keep a secure hold on your purse or handbag.
- If you go to an Automatic Teller Machine (ATM) for cash, check for people around.
- Be aware of "good deal" scams. Things are not always as they appear. "If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is."



- If you are purchasing toys for small children, be sure they are safe.
- Drive defensively! Traffic is heavier during the holidays.
- Don't place your Christmas gift boxes out for garbage pick up. You are advertising what your home has to offer.

Make sure your home is protected while you are not there. The best plan is to make it look like you never left; keep it looking occupied.

- Use timers and motion sensor lights; timers to give the appearance someone is inside.
- Keep window blinds turned in an upward position.
- Stop your mail and newspaper service, or have a neighbor pick them up for you.
- Turn your telephone ringer down or off, and don't announce your absence on an answering machine.
- Don't post you are away on "Facebook" or other social media sites. Post all your vacation pictures when you return.
- Place your Christmas tree and presents out of view.
