

**City of Sanford, Florida
City Manager's Monthly Update
March 2023**

CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

- **Parking Garage/Monroe Hall Redevelopment Project**
 - The mixed-use redevelopment Request for Qualifications (RFQ) closed last week with one (1) bidder. Purchasing is processing the documentation received. The next step is the formation of a Committee to evaluate the proposal.
- **Mayfair Golf Course**
 - Our tree contractor will be working on clearing debris from Hurricane Ian throughout the course and driving range. ZHA Associates, our contracted consultant, is reviewing the construction documents for the construction of the Clubhouse for CPH engineering firm to revise for purchasing and rebid. Grading and sod placement on Hole #3 (next to the main water Plant) is anticipated to be completed by the end of April.
- **Downtown Sanford Marina**
 - Installation of the boat racks inside the dry stack building are scheduled to begin the first week of April. This should increase the amount of boats stored inside the building. Once the building permit is issued, the construction/ rebuild of the ship store will continue – finishing drywall and painting this week. The roof has been completed of the Barbara Lee & Lake Monroe Sailing Association building. The Public Restroom is close to being completed – the plumber has about an hour of work to do, then it will be open to the public. Permitting of the docks are in process.
- **William Clark Court Purchase of Land**
 - This item is on the Sanford Housing Authority's next meeting agenda scheduled on April 6 for consideration.
- **Fire Station Design Contract**
 - Negotiations continue with the architect. The goal is to have the design contract before the City Commission at the first meeting in April for their consideration.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS/NEIGHBORHOOD ENGAGEMENT

- **Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)**
 - National Community Development week is April 10 through April 15, 2023. A proclamation has been prepared for the Mayor to read at the April 10th City Commission meeting. Staff plans to hold an informational reception and meet the program staff on April 10.
 - Nineteen home inspections have been completed for the Minor Home Repair Program. A request for procurement of a general contractor has been sent to purchasing for repairs such as roofing, plumbing, Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC), electrical and/or Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) modifications.

 - Implementing an automated appointment scheduling service to assist staff with scheduling appointments. Callers can schedule an appointment through the system 24-hours a day.
- **Race, Equality, Equity, and Inclusion Advisory Committee**
 - With four newly appointed and/or selected committee members, held inaugural meeting of the standing advisory committee on Monday, March 20.
- **Youth Empowerment and Leadership Development Academy (YELDA)**
 - Application window opens for youth summer employment opportunities in April for 15 City of Sanford students between the ages of 16-19.

DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

- **Planning**
 - The Parking Regulations are moving forward. City Planning staff conducted two (2) work sessions with the Planning and Zoning Commission earlier this year and held the formal Public Hearing on March 2, 2023 on the proposed modifications. The input provided at that hearing is being worked into the reports which should be presented to the City Commission in April.
 - City is continuing to work on the Community Rating System and the Local Mitigation Strategy as they relate to our participation in the National Flood Insurance Program. A future Work Session presentation is being coordinated as it relates to the subject.

DEVELOPMENT SERVICES CONTINUED

- Land Development Regulations modifications currently in the works for presentation to the City Commission later this year include Schedule F for Single family residential parking, patio and deck standards to include revised and strengthened permitting procedures and Schedule E to update criteria for specific uses including pharmacy, auto sales, multiple family residential and outdoor storage.
- **Code Enforcement**
 - Code Enforcement will be holding their “in-house” training academy for the new hires this month.
 - Code Officers have begun with parking enforcement throughout the City of Sanford.
 - Code Officers will be returning to uniforms.
 - We are expanding the Nights and Weekends position and will now have 7 days per week coverage.
- **Building**
 - Building is leading the effort to implement Central Square and replace Citizenserve.
 - The City Hall Breezeway expansion plan is approaching 90% completion.
 - Building is fully staffed.
 - Building has full time staffing on Fridays (Permit Coordinator).
- **Business Tax Receipts**
 - We are negotiating a contract with a third party provider to identify delinquent/unknown businesses operating within the City.

PARKS AND RECREATION

- Ft Mellon Playground Repairs and Upgrade:
 - Additional material was ordered for the substrate. This was approved by the Commission on March 14th. Estimated reopening April 10th.
 - Repair to capstone on seawall:
 - Currently under construction.
 - Contractor began work at Mellonville Avenue and is working westbound.
 - Irrigation repairs on RiverWalk:
 - Major repairs are needed from the Civic Center east to Mellonville Avenue.
 - This bid opened on March 28th.
 - Sod replacement on RiverWalk:
 - Sod replacement has been completed from French Ave / 17-92 east to the Civic Center.

PARKS AND RECREATION CONTINUED

- Remainder is on hold until irrigation repairs can be made.
- Stadium Roof replacement
 - Bid has been awarded and the project will begin in the next 2 weeks.
- Jeff Triplett Community Center
 - Ongoing repairs to roof and siding. These are storm related issues as well.
- Lee P. Moore basketball court rehab
 - Event has been rescheduled to Wednesday, April 5 at 330pm as requested by the Orlando Magic due to vendor delays.

POLICE

- Completed and ratified the Officer, Sergeant and Lieutenants Collective Bargaining contracts for 2022-2025.
- Have increased our recruiting efforts to include a new program called “MILE’s,” which stands for Mentoring Introduction Law Enforcement. The program will accept Police Cadets with a minimum age of 20 and prepared them to become Sanford Police Officers. We hope to get the program in place within the next month and being training people prior to attend the academy. The goal is to start training our future in house prior to the academy. We believe this could be a big step in our recruitment and training.
- Presently have 2 Cadets/Officers who will be graduating from the academy Mid-April and we had 2 new Cadet/Officers who began on March 23rd.
- Held a District 3 Community meeting at Action Church.
- Have held a number of Community talks for Seniors with a focus on “Scam, Frauds and Taxes.”
- Even with our shortage, we have attended a number of community events.

PUBLIC WORKS

- Completion of design and awarded construction contract for Georgetown Roadway and Drainage Project Phase One: \$4,000,000. CPH engineering firm and City staff are working on shop drawings, a meeting was held about the use of Ft. Mellon Park. CPH is starting on Phase 2 design.
- Substantially Completed construction of the Myrtle Avenue Streetscape project - \$4,000,000.
- Completed design, permitting for Mellonville Avenue and Celery Avenue intersection improvements. Should go out to bid next month.
- Completed 90% design for the Washington Avenue - Randolph Avenue – Mellonville Avenue project.
- Drainage improvements - 100% plans are due this month. Plan to move forward with bidding in May.
- Completed 90% design for Maple Avenue Stormwater Project which is scheduled for April.
- Completed 90% Design of the Mayfair Area Drainage Improvements Project.
- Architectural review and site permitting for Public Works Emergency

PUBLIC WORKS CONTINUED

- Operations Building / Annex.
- CPH is finalizing the Celery Ave-Mellonville Avenue Intersection Improvements project along with St. Johns Parkway-Upsala Rd. intersection improvements so they can bid together. Should go out to bid next month.
- Completed 90% design, permitting of Aero Lane and 5th Street roadway and drainage improvements project: \$85,000.
- Completed 20% Plan Design for Park Drive Streetscape and Roadway Improvements. - \$300,000.
- Re-lining Pump Branch pipe from 13th Street to 20th Street - \$2,000,000. Will be put out to bid soon.
- Construction of the Trailhead Bathroom at old PBA site on Riverwalk will go to Commission once all proposals are in.
- All Terrain is installing inlets and new piping on Maplewood Drive.
- Change parking lot lights at the Civic Center to L.E.D.
- Carpet Cleaned at the Sanford Information Center (SIC)
- Replaced LED street light heads on Historic Goldsboro BLVD from 17/92 to William Clark BLVD.
- Add LED lighting to parking areas on Sanford Avenue and 3rd Street.
- Install flood lighting for the new Groveview residential sign.
